

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 700540

Quarter corner common to Section 12, Range 1 West, and Section 7, Range 1 East, Township 38 South, W.M.

Found remains of original NW BT recorded by Ives and Hyde in 1854, now a White Oak stump shell, with section of rotted tree alongside, containing partial reversed impression of scribed "¼".

From the preceding evidence, I set a 1 x 36-inch G.I. pipe 30 inches in the ground with a 2½-inch bronze disc marked:

R1W R1E

¼S
1975

From which:

- Said stump bears record, N59°W, 236.28 feet to estimated face.

I marked new trees CS BT and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- A White Oak, 11-inch diameter, bears N21°18'E, 188.53 feet.
- A White Oak, 5-inch diameter, bears S20°37'W, 26.45 feet.

I set a ⅝-inch x 16-inch re-steel rod, flush, which bears N31°21'30"E, 72.52 feet.

Corner lies on West slope, on old down North-South fence line, about 420 feet, N10°W, from most Westerly edge of curve of road to micro-wave station.
