

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

DLC66NNE

GCDB 866100

North Northeast corner of DLC #66, Township 38 South, Range 1 West, W.M.

Found an old $\frac{3}{4}$ " iron pin set for corner. This pin agrees favorably with a very old fence running Westerly, and the government record position of the Southeast witness tree for the Southeast corner of DLC #62, said witness tree now being marked by a ring of Black Oak sprouts around an old stump hole.

Replaced said $\frac{3}{4}$ " iron pin with a 1" x 36" galvanized iron pipe; with bronze cap stamped:

T38S R1W
NNE Cor.
C.S.
DLC No. 66
1963

Set 40" in the ground for corner.

From which:

- The center of an 8" Black Oak (not scribed) bears N31 $\frac{1}{4}$ °W, 75.7 feet.
- A 12" Black Oak, scribed CS-BT bears S80 $\frac{1}{4}$ °W, 77.9 feet to the face of the tree.
- Found a $\frac{1}{2}$ " iron pipe which bears S89 $\frac{3}{4}$ °W, 39.93 feet.

SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

DLC66NNE

North Northeast corner to DLC No. 66, located in Section 27, Township 38 South, Range 1 West, W.M.

At the corner, found 4 inches deep, the 1-inch diameter iron pipe with brass cap marked:

T38S R1W
NNE Cor.
C
DLC No. 66
1963

Bearing trees recorded in 1963 found and measured to center of trees near base:

- Black Oak, now 16-inch diameter, with healed blazes, bears $S80^{\circ}15'W$, 78.30 feet. Record: 77.9 feet (to face).
- Black Oak, now 18-inch diameter (no scribe recorded), bears Record: $N31^{\circ}15'W$, 75.70 feet.
- I bark-scribed this tree "CS" "BT", which is located in an "island" in the asphalt parkway of residence 6626 Tarry Lane.
- The $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter pipe reference, reported in 1963, could not be found

Take new references:

- A found $\frac{5}{8}$ -inch diameter iron pin, being a "ground" for Power Pole No. d-10926, bears $S8^{\circ}24'W$, 24.06 feet.
- Set $\frac{5}{8}$ x 24-inch rebar, with yellow plastic cap, flush with and near the center of asphalt surface of Tarry Lane bears West, 20.60 feet.

Corner lies 16 feet West of most Westerly row of orchard trees.
