

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT'

Section corner common to Sections 7, 8, 17 and 18, Township 39 South, Range 3 East, W.M.

Found a red top stake in a mound of stone.

Replaced said stake with a 1" x 36" galvanized iron pipe 34" in the ground in a mound of rock, with a 2½" bronze cap stamped:

For corner.

From which:

- The original bearing tree (now a 26" White Fir with scribe visible) bears N29°E, 68.0 feet to face of the upper blaze.
- The original bearing tree (now a dead Fir with open faces and scribe visible) has been dozed out by Burnt Creek Road construction and is lying in a slash pile nearby.

Marked new trees as follows:

- A 13" White Fir, scribed CS-BT bears S67°E, 24.2 feet to the face of the lower blaze.
- A 9" White Fir, scribed CS-BT bears S83°W, 67.0 feet to the face of the lower blaze.
- A 15" yellow Pine, scribed CS-BT bears N36¾°W, 27.2 feet to the face of the lower blaze.
- A 15" White Fir, scribed CS-BT bears N6¼°E, 28.4 feet to the face of the lower blaze.

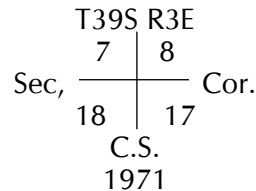

SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 200500

Section corner common to Sections 7, 8, 17 and 18, Township 39 South, Range 3 East, W.M.

Found at the corner position, flush in a ring of stones, the 2½-inch diameter brass cap set on First Re-establishment in 1971, marked:



Single remaining original bearing tree recorded by E. T. T. Fisher in 1858,

- A fir snag now 26-inch diameter with opened, rotted upper face bears record, N 29° E, 67.98 feet to estimated face.

Bearing trees recorded on First Re-establishment, found with healed double blazes and measured to center of trees at lower blaze:

- White Fir snag bears S67° E, 24.5 feet. Record: 24.2 feet to face.
- White Fir, dead and down bears S 88° W, 67.2 feet to center of stump hole. Record: S 83° W, 67.0 feet to face.
- Yellow Pine, now 29-inch diameter bears N 36¼ ° W, 27.8 feet. Record: 27.2 feet to face.
- White Fir, dead and down bears N 6¼ ° E, 28.8 feet to center of stump hole. Record: 28.4 feet to face.

Marked new bearing trees "CS" "BT" and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Yellow Pine 6-inch diameter bears S 14¼ ° E, 50.3 feet.
- Yellow Pine 9-inch diameter bears S 22¼ ° W, 66.1 feet.

Corner lies approximately 120 feet north of graveled road at west edge of meadow.
