

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 200600

Section corner common to Sections 5, 6, 7 and 8, Township 39 South, Range 3 East, W.M.

From the following original evidence, at the location described below, set a 2½ x 30-inch Galvanized iron pipe, 21 inches in the ground with a 2½-inch diameter brass cap marked:

Original bearing trees recorded by S. Truax in 1858 found:

- Sawed White Fir stump, 38-inch diameter with visible scribed "BT" on opened face, bears Record: S61°W, 241.56 feet to face.
- White Fir snag, 15-inch diameter, scribed "RS5" on opened face, bears Record: N79°E, 208.56 feet to upper face.
- A stump depression bears Record: N69°W, 110.88 feet.
- Found remains of the Southeast tree with visible scribe mks "RS8", but could not determine where the tree came from, due to disturbance of logging activity.

Marked new trees "CS" "BT" and took measurements to center of tree at lower blaze:

- White Fir, 10-inch diameter, bears N78°47'E, 4.70 feet.
- White Fir, 28-inch diameter, bears S12°E, 47.40 feet.
- White Fir, 18-inch diameter, bears S14°38'W, 40.55 feet.
- White Fir, 11-inch diameter, bears N54°37'W, 21.70 feet.

Corner lies on South slope with large opening to the South, approximately 200 feet.
