

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 240400

Quarter corner common to Sections 17 and 20, Township 39 South, Range 3 East, W.M.

Set a 1" x 36" galvanized iron pipe 28" in the ground on a rocky ridge, said pipe is leaning Easterly and has a 2½" bronze cap stamped:

T39S R3E
17
¼S — Cor.
20
C.S.
1967

From which:

- A 30" Pine plainly scribed bears N15°W, 81.8 feet to the face of the upper blaze.
- A large Pine stump badly rotted with a pitched and scribed face still in place bears S6°E, 139.9 feet.
- Scribed an 18" Fir CS-BT which bears S55°W, 8.9 feet to the face of the lower blaze.

SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 240400

Quarter corner common to Sections 17 and 20, Township 39 South, Range 3 East, W.M.

Found at the corner position, exposed 6 inches and in a mound of stones, the 1-inch diameter galvanized iron pipe with 2½-inch diameter brass cap set on First Re-establishment in 1967, marked:

JACKSON COUNTY
17
¼S — Cor.
20
C.S.
1967

Note: Pipe is leaning easterly, however it fits distance to westerly bearing tree, so it was probably set this way due to rocks below the surface.

- Single remaining bearing tree recorded by E. T. T. Fisher in 1858, a Yellow Pine now 32-inch diameter with opened upper blaze and visible scribe marks “/4S” fits reasonably well. Accurate measurement is not possible due to 24-inch diameter fir which has grown up on line and approximately 15 feet from corner.
- Bearing tree recorded on said First Re-establishment, a Douglas Fir, now 26-inch diameter with double healed blazes, bears S55°W, 9.3 feet to center at lower blaze. Record: 8.9 feet to face.

Marked new trees “CS” “BT” and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Yellow Pine 14-inch diameter bears N24½°E, 14.0 feet.
- Douglas Fir 11-inch diameter bears S33¼°E, 6.4 feet.

Corner lies approximately 300 feet south of old logging road.
