

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 500140

Quarter corner common to Sections 34 and 35, Township 39 South, Range 3 East, W.M. $V = 16\frac{1}{2}^\circ$

Found, 1-inch diameter iron pipe projecting 21 inches with a 2½-inch diameter bronze disc marked and set as recorded by Fred W. Rodolf in 1917.

I found the following references:

- Ponderosa Pine, rotted stump, (was recorded as a Fir), 26-inch diameter, no scribes visible. Bears Record: $N23^\circ W$, 5.28 feet to estimated face.
- Douglas Fir, 54-inch diameter, with visible "T: scribe in open burnt face. Bears $S51^\circ E$, 79.18 feet to face, Record: $S61^\circ 15'E$, 105.60 feet.
- **Note:** There is a 6-inch Growth since being scribed so this tree was 42-inch diameter when scribed and not 16-inch diameter as recorded.

I mark the following trees CS BT and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Douglas Fir, 12-inch diameter bears $N25\frac{1}{2}^\circ E$, 19.5 feet.
- White Fir, 8-inch diameter bears $S42\frac{1}{2}^\circ W$, 12.0 feet.
