

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 200440

Quarter corner common to Sections 18 and 17, Township 39 South, Range 4 East, W.M.  $V = 20^\circ$

Found, the only remaining original BT recorded by S. Truax in 1859, a White Fir, now 18-inch diameter, scribed "T" in partially exposed lower face.

From the preceding evidence, I set a 1 x 36-inch Galvanized iron pipe 26 inches in the ground with a 2½-inch bronze disc marked:

From which,

- The above original BT bears Record:  $S70^\circ E$ , 17.16 feet to scribed face.

I mounded stones around corner, marked new trees CS BT and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- White Fir, 12-inch diameter bears  $S35\frac{1}{2}^\circ E$ , 33.58 feet
- White Fir, 12-inch diameter bears  $S46^\circ W$ , 67.78 feet.
- A found copper-nickel pipe, ¾-inch diameter, projecting 10 inches in a mound of stone bears West, 2.45 feet.

Corner lies on blazed North-South line, about 385 feet South of location marker on 12-inch diameter Fir, alongside road.
