

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 240400

Quarter corner common to Sections 17 and 20, Township 39 South, Range 4 East, W.M.  $V = 19^\circ$

In a found mound of stones I set a 1 x 36-inch Galvanized iron pipe 24 inches in the ground with a 2½-inch bronze disc marked:

Jackson County 1975  
T39S R4E  
17  
¼S —  
20

Found, disturbed, among said stones, the original, 15 x 10 x 10-inch (record, 12 x 8 x 8-inch) stone, marked "¼" as recorded by P. Applegate in 1893.

Original BTs found as follows:

- Sugar Pine snag, 24-inch diameter, scribed "¼S" in exposed face bears Record: S82°E, 15.18 feet to scribed face.
- White Fir, 25-inch diameter, with healed blazes bears Record: N26°W, 17.82 feet to estimated face.

I marked new trees CS BT and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Fir, 9-inch diameter bears N27½°E, 36.15 feet.
- Fir, 12-inch diameter bears S27°E, 29.48 feet.
