

**FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT
CORNER COMMON TO SECTIONS 32 AND 33 ONLY
GCDB 300100**

Section corner common to Sections 32 and 33, Township 39 South, Range 4 East, W.M.

Found remains of original BTs Southeast, Southwest and Northeast.

From which:

- Set 2" x 36" galvanized pipe for corner.

From which:

- A 14" Yellow Pine bears N51°45'W, 31.8 feet.
- A 12" Yellow Pine bears N52°E, 91 feet scribed CS-BT.
- Scribed a 22" Yellow Pine CS-BT which bears S45°15'E, 139.8 feet.
- Scribed a 4" Yellow Pine CS-BT which bears S31°30'W, 61.5 feet.

CORNER COMMON TO SECTIONS 32 AND 33 ONLY

Standard corner common to Sections 32 and 33, Township 39 South, Range 4 East, W.M.
 $V = 18\frac{3}{4}^\circ$

Inside the found 2-inch diameter Galvanized iron pipe set by C. Z. Boyden on First Re-establishment in 1929, I drove a 1 x 36-inch Galvanized iron pipe 26 inches in the ground with a 2½-inch bronze disc marked:

- An original BT marked by E.T.T. Fisher in 1858, now a Pine stump shell 28-inch diameter, scribed "BT" bears $N35\frac{1}{2}^\circ E$, 40.92 feet to scribed face. Record: $N30^\circ E$, 40.92 feet.
- A stump hole with Pine fragments found at record location of original SE BT.

BTs recorded by Boyden found as follows:

- A Ponderosa Pine, 24-inch diameter, with healed blazes bears $N52^\circ E$, 91.58 feet to center of tree. Record: $N52^\circ E$, 91.5 feet.
- The stump remains of a Pine, including piece scribed "BT" bears Record: $S45\frac{1}{4}^\circ E$, 139.8 feet.
- A Ponderosa Pine, 21-inch diameter, with healed blazes bears Record: $S31\frac{1}{2}^\circ W$, 61.5 feet to center of tree.
- The stump remains, with sections of Pine alongside scribed "CS" and "BT" bears Record: $N51\frac{3}{4}^\circ W$, 31.8 feet.

I mound stone around corner, marked the following trees CS BT and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- A Ponderosa Pine, 11-inch diameter bears $S36\frac{1}{2}^\circ E$, 38.6 feet.
- A Ponderosa Pine, 14-inch diameter bears $N41\frac{1}{4}^\circ W$, 63.5 feet.

Corner lies 2 feet SE of the corner of North and West bearing fences.
