

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 600640

Quarter corner common to Sections 1 and 2, Township 39 South, Range 4 East, W.M.  $V = 20\frac{3}{4}^\circ$

Found, original NW BT, recorded by S. Truax in 1859, now a rotted Pine stump core about 14-inch diameter, with section alongside containing axed chain notch and scribed "BT."

From the preceding evidence I set a 1 x 36-inch Galvanized iron pipe 24 inches in the ground with a 2½-inch bronze disc marked:

From which,

- The above original BT bears Record: N19°W, 14.52 feet to estimated face.
- The record location of the original SE BT, now gone, is in skid road.

I marked new trees CS BT and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Cedar, 6-inch diameter bears S51¾°E, 9.13 feet.
- Cedar, 15-inch diameter bears S22°W, 69.83 feet.
- A found mound of stone bears N84°E, 10.0 feet.

Corner lies about 450 feet South of location marker on 18-inch diameter Douglas Fir, alongside road.

## SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 600640

Quarter corner common to Sections 1 and 2, Township 39 South, Range 4 East, W.M.

Found at the corner position, exposed 12 inches and in a mound of stones, the 1-inch diameter galvanized iron pipe with a 2½-inch diameter brass cap, set on First Re-establishment in 1975, marked:

JACKSON COUNTY 1975  
T39S R4E  
¼S  
2 • 1

Single remaining original bearing tree recorded by Sewall Truax of the GLO in 1859,

- A sawed, rotted pine stump bears Record: N 19° W, 14.5 feet to estimated face.

Bearing trees recorded on First Re-establishment in 1975, found with healed double blazes and measured to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Cedar, now 14-inch diameter bears Record: S 51¾° E, 9.1 feet.
- Cedar high-stump, now 20-inch diameter bears S 21° W, 69.8 feet. Record: S 22° W.

Marked new bearing trees "CS" "BT" and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Ponderosa Pine 8-inch diameter bears S 58½° E, 82.3 feet.
- Cedar 8-inch diameter bears N 27° W, 76.6 feet.
- Recent clear-cut. No other trees of size within limits.

Corner lies approximately 450 feet south of dirt logging road.
