Found, ³/₄ x 42-inch copper-nickel pipe, projecting 12 inches in mound of stone.

I replaced said pipe with a 1 x 36-inch Galvanized iron pipe set 23 inches in the ground with a 2½-inch bronze disc marked:

Original BTs recorded by S. Truax in 1859, found as follows:

- A sawed Sugar Pine stump, 30-inch diameter, containing chaining notch (4½ inches from center of stump) in axed face bears Record: \$50°W, 14.52 feet to said notch.
- A stump hole with Pine fragments found at record location of original NW BT.

I deposited found pipe alongside corner, marked new trees CS BT, and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Douglas Fir, 8-inch diameter bears \$11°W, 7.82 feet.
- Douglas Fir, 10-inch diameter bears N5°W, 46.42 feet.

Corner lies 35 feet West of ridge top and about 250 feet East of location marker on 5-inch diameter Ponderosa Pine, alongside road.

Quarter corner common to Sections 24 and 25, Township 39 South, Range 4 East, W.M.

Found at the corner, exposed 8 inches and in a mound of stones, the 1-inch diameter galvanized iron pipe with 2½-inch diameter brass cap set on First Re-establishment in 1975, and marked:

Original bearing tree recorded by Sewall Truax in 1859,

• A Sugar Pine, now a 30-inch diameter sawed stump bears Record: S 50° W, 14.52 feet to chaining notch.

Bearing trees marked on First Re-establishment in 1975, found and measured to center of tree at lower blaze:

- Douglas Fir, now 12-inch diameter and high-stumped with healed blazes bears Record: N 5° W, 46.42 feet.
- Douglas Fir, now a 15-inch diameter sawed stump bears S 11° W, 7.66 feet. Record: 7.82 feet.

Marked new trees "CS" "BT" and took measurements to center of tree at lower blaze:

- Douglas Fir 6-inch diameter bears N 10¼° E, 48.78 feet.
- White Fir 5-inch diameter bears \$ 39° E, 6.66 feet.
- No other trees within limits.

Corner lies on northwesterly corner of top of knob and approximately 350 feet east of cinder road.
