

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 700700

Township corner common to Townships 38 and 39 South, Ranges 4 and 5 East, W.M.

Found a 2-inch diameter iron pipe projecting 8 inches, with a 2 7/8-inch brass cap set on Survey No. 5550, dated 1973 marked:

Original bearing trees recorded by Fred Mench in 1911 found and measured to the center of tree at base:

- Sawed Ponderosa Pine stump, 26-inch diameter and 5 feet high, axed open, but no visible scribe marks bears S6½°E, 28.87 feet. Record: 29.04 feet.
- Ponderosa Pine, 29-inch diameter, axed open but no visible scribe marks bears S4°W, 33.50 feet. Record: 33.66 feet.
- Ponderosa Pine, 26-inch diameter, containing visible scribe marks on exposed face bears N74°W, 73.27 feet. Record: 71.94 feet.

Marked new trees "CS" "BT" and took measurements to the center of tree at lower blaze:

- Incense Cedar, 8-inch diameter bears N89¾°E, 32.90 feet.
- Ponderosa Pine, 14-inch diameter bears N23½°E, 15.75 feet.

Corner lies on South slope in partially logged area and approximately 150 feet easterly of a rock outcrop.
