

## FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 200440

Quarter corner common to Sections 17 and 18, Township 40 South, Range 3 West, W.M.

Found the original Northwest bearing tree, now a 20" White Oak with the  $\frac{1}{4}$ S scribe exposed and the bearing tree scribe intact which bears N41°W, 38.94 feet, as reported in the original survey,

Also found a 1" x 36" galvanized iron pipe set 34" in the ground for the true corner from which corner:

- An 8" White Oak scribed "CS-BT" bears N25°E, 44.3 feet.
- Scribe a 30" Black Oak "CS-BT" which bears S41½°E, 60.3 feet.
- A small draw bears North 21 feet.

## SECOND RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 200440

Quarter corner common to Sections 17 and 18 of Township 40 South, Range 3 West, W.M.

Found at corner position exposed 8 inches in a mound of stones, the 3-inch diameter galvanized iron pipe with a 3½-inch diameter brass cap set by the BLM in 1964 and marked:

Single remaining original bearing tree recorded by Samuel W. Lackland of the GLO in 1882 found with a single healed blaze and measured to center at base:

- White Oak now 24-inch diameter bears Record: N41°W, 38.9 feet.

Single remaining bearing tree recorded on First Re-establishment found with healed double blaze and measured to center at lower blaze:

- Black Oak now a rotted stump bears S 40° E, 60.1 feet. Record: S41½°E.

Bearing trees recorded by the BLM in 1964 found with healed single blazes and measured to center at base:

- Ponderosa Pine now 17-inch diameter bears Record: N87°E, 31.0 feet.
- Ponderosa Pine now 17-inch diameter bears S60½°W, 10.3 feet. Record: S 60° W.

Bearing tree recorded on Survey No. 11069 in 1987 found with healed double blazes and measured to center at lower blaze:

- White Oak now 12-inch diameter bears Record: N23¾°E, 64.6 feet.

Marked new bearing tree "CS" "BT" and measured to center at lower blaze:

- Ponderosa Pine 14-inch diameter bears S72°E, 30.8 feet.

Corner lies approximately 5 feet south-east of "T" in meandering fence and approximately 10 feet north of Mule Mt. Trail.
