

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 200540

Quarter corner common to Sections 7 and 8, Township 40 South, Range 3 West, W.M.

Found the stone corner monument marked "¼" on the West face. Also found original Pine bearing tree with old face to the Southeast and the original White Oak bearing tree with scribe marks plain to the Southwest.

Replaced the stone with a 1" x 36" galvanized iron pipe with a 2½" brass cap stamped:

T40S R3W
¼ 7 | 8 cor.
C.S.
1962

30" in the ground for corner.

From which:

- The original bearing tree (now a 24" Yellow Pine) bears S20°E, 24.5 feet to the center of the tree.
- The original bearing tree (now a 12" White Oak) plainly scribed "¼S-BT" bears S21°W, 19.3 feet to the face.

From said pipe corner, I establish the following new witness trees:

- A 20" Black Oak scribed CS-BT bears N68½°W, 14.8 feet to the blazed face.
- A 16" forked Black Oak scribed CS-BT bears N32°E, 17.1 feet to the blazed face.
- Deposited the stone monument alongside the pipe corner.
