

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 400700

Section corner common to Section 33 and 34, Twp. 39 South, Range 3 West and Section 3 and 4, Twp. 40 South, Range 3 West, W.M. $V = 18\frac{1}{2}^\circ$

From the following evidence at the location described below, I set a 1x36-inch Galvanized iron pipe flush with the ground with a 2½-inch bronze disc marked:

Original BTs recorded by S. Truax in 1857 found as follows:

- Laurel, 29-inch diameter with burned out center bears $N30^\circ E$, 65.0 feet to center. Record, $N30^\circ E$, 66.0 feet.
- Rotted pine stump, about 36-inch diameter, with section alongside containing partial scribed "T" and "4" bears $S71^\circ E$, 44.4 feet to center. Record, $S71^\circ E$, 41.58 feet.
- The stump hole of a down and burned pine, found at record location of S.W. BT.
- Rotted White Oak, 15-inch diameter, scribed "BT" in exposed lower face bears $N51^\circ W$, 55.0 feet to scribed face. Record, $N51^\circ W$, 65.34 feet

I marked new trees C.S. BT and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Black Oak, 9-inch diameter bears $N36\frac{1}{2}^\circ E$, 22.80 feet.
- Douglas Fir, 10-inch diameter bears $S28\frac{3}{4}^\circ W$, 41.50 feet.
- Ponderosa Pine, 16-inch diameter bears $S74\frac{1}{2}^\circ W$, 34.75 feet.
- Black Oak, 6-inch diameter bears $N53^\circ W$, 18.75 feet.
- **Note:** No suitable tree in S.E. quadrant.

Corner lies about 400 feet East of 6-inch diameter White Oak, with axed "X" on ridge top (overlooking McKee Bridge).
