

**FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT**

**GCDB 500540**

Quarter corner common to Sections 10 and 11, Township 40 South, Range 3 West, W.M.

At the corner, found firmly set the original 18 x 8 x 6-inch stone, marked "¼" on West side.

Replaced found stone with and deposited it alongside a 2 x 30-inch Galvanized iron pipe with 2½-inch diameter brass cap marked:

T40S R3W  
¼S  
10 | 11  
C.S.  
1983

The single remaining original bearing tree, recorded by S. Lackland in 1882,

- Now a down Madrone, 8-inch diameter, containing scribe marks including "S" and "BT" in rotted faces, the base and root remains of which bears Record: N4°E, 10.56 feet.

Marked new trees "CS" "BT" and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Ponderosa Pine, 13-inch diameter bears S13°E, 6.20 feet.
- Douglas Fir, 13-inch diameter bears N17°W, 8.80 feet.

Corner lies on steep (60%) East slope, about 40 feet East of top of ridge C. North-South.
