Found projecting 12 inches, the 1-inch diameter iron pipe with GLO brass cap marked:

1917 by M. Wright in 1917.

Bearing trees recorded by Wright found as follows:

- Douglas Fir, 19-inch diameter with healed single blaze bears \$39°E, 19.0 feet to center of tree. Record: \$40½°E, 12.54 feet.
- Ponderosa Pine, 24-inch diameter, scribed "S1 SC BT" in partly healed face bears S20°W, 26.14 feet to center of tree. Record: S19°W, 25.74 feet.

**Note:** The above trees are erroneously recorded by Wright as bearing trees to the North ¼ of Section 2, T40S, R3W.

I marked a new tree CS BT:

- Douglas Fir, 16-inch diameter bears N37°W, 50.80 feet to center of tree at lower blaze.
- The (brass cap) South ¼ corner of Section 36 bears East 16.40 feet.

Corner lies on steep NE slope, an estimated 150 feet East of location marker on 36-inch diameter Pine alongside trail C. S30°E.

Found exposed 12 ins. the 1 in. diameter iron pipe with 2 ½ ins. diameter standard GLO brass cap, per first re-establishment dated 1977, cap marked:



References per first re-establishment found:

- Douglas fir, 24 ins. diameter, with single healed blaze, bears S41°11′12″E, 19.00 feet to center of tree. Record: S39°E.
- 24 ins. diameter sawed-off pine stump, 3 feet high, with visible scribing on partially rotten face, bears \$16°32′15″W, 26.14 feet to center of tree. Record: \$20°W.
- Douglas fir, 18 ins. diameter, dead, with double healed blazes, bears N36°04′20″W, 50.80 feet to center of tree at lower blaze. Record: N37°W.
- The brass capped south quarter corner of section 36, T39S R3W, W.M., found per second re-establishment dated 2020, bears N89°16′25″E, 16.31 feet. Record: East, 16.40 feet.

Set new references, 5/8 x 24 ins. rebar with 2 ins. diameter aluminum caps marked "Jackson County Surveyor":

- 3 ins. deep, on west edge of north-south bearing gravel road, 21 feet north of 7 ins. diameter madrone, bears \$17°16'08"W, 296.48 feet.
- 1 in. deep, bears \$64°37′33″W, 45.05 feet.
