

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 700140

Quarter corner common to Section 31, Township 40 South, Range 2 West and Section 36, Township 40 South, Range 3 West, W.M.

At the corner, found firmly set, the original 15 x 10 x 8-inch stone (no discernible marks).

Replaced found stone with and deposited it alongside a 1 x 36-inch Galvanized iron pipe set 24 inches in the ground with a 2½-inch diameter bronze cap marked:

Jackson County 1981
T40S
R3W R2W
36 | 31
¼S

Original bearing trees marked by S.W. Lackland, in 1882 found:

- Manzanita, 8-inch diameter at base, partially dead bears N57°E, 7.26 feet to center. (No scribe found)
- Manzanita, 12-inch diameter at base, now dead, containing scribed "¼S" and partial "BT" bears N46°W, 7.62 feet to scribed upper face.

Marked new trees "CS" "BT" and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- Black Oak, 6-inch diameter bears S5°W, 27.30 feet.
- Ponderosa Pine, 5-inch diameter bears S58°W, 26.07 feet.
- A found ⅝-inch diameter rebar, projecting 6 inches bears North 0.58 feet.

Reference Survey No. 4767.

Corner lies on North-South blazed line in Manzanita field on South (65%) slope.
