

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 700600

Section corner common to Sections 1 and 12, Township 40 South, Range 3 West, and Section 6 and 7, Township 40 South, Range 2 West, W.M. $V = 18^\circ$

Found firmly set, a 16 x 12 x 6-inch stone, Record: (17 x 12 x 12-inch) marked with "X" on top (No discernable notches).

Original bearing trees recorded by S. Lackland in 1882 found as follows:

- Stump hole found at record location of NE BT.
- White Oak, 12-inch diameter, with axed out upper face bears $S17\frac{1}{2}^\circ E$, 46.2 feet on slope. Record: $S18^\circ E$, 46.2 feet. Re-measured 45.78 feet to estimated upper face.
- The most Easterly branch, 16-inch diameter, scribed "SR 3W S12" in partly exposed face, of a multiple, 77-inch diameter Madrone bears $S55^\circ W$, 104.54 feet to scribed face. Record: $S55^\circ W$, 104.28 feet
- This tree stands on top of N-S ridge.
- The NW BT is now gone.

I replaced with and deposited found stone alongside a 1 x 36-inch Galvanized iron pipe, set 26 inches in the ground with a 2½-inch bronze disc marked:

And mark the following trees CS BT and took measurements to center of trees at lower blaze:

- White Oak, 8-inch diameter bears $N17\frac{1}{2}^\circ E$, 11.60 feet.
- Black Oak, 9-inch diameter bears $N69^\circ E$, 48.30 feet.
- The most Westerly branch, 5-inch diameter, of a double White Oak bears $S11\frac{1}{2}^\circ E$, 14.10 feet.
- **Note:** No suitable tree in NW quadrant.

Corner lies on SE slope.
