

FIRST RE-ESTABLISHMENT

GCDB 200640

Quarter corner common to Sections 5 and 6, Township 41 South, Range 2 West, W.M.

At the corner, found firmly set in mound of stone, the original 18x12x8 inches stone marked "¼" on West face, as recorded by E. Henry in 1908.

Replaced said stone with and deposited it alongside a 2x31-inch Galvanized iron pipe set 25 inches in the ground with 2½-inch diameter brass cap marked:

C.S.

Original bearing trees found:

- White Oak, 13-inch diameter, with healed single blaze bears record, N85°E, 28.38 feet on slope. Re-measured 26.82 feet to center of tree.
- Ponderosa Pine, 56-inch diameter, with healed single blaze bears Record: N83°W, 59.4 feet to center of tree.

Mounded stones around corner and mark a new tree "CS" "BT":

- Douglas Fir, 9-inch diameter bears N33°W, 18.15 feet to center of tree at lower blaze.

Corner lies about 100 feet South of spring branch c. West and 40 feet South of top of small ridge c. West.
